FABRIC CHOICES

This quilt uses 8 fabrics. I chose a light background, 3 shades of purple, light, medium and dark in tone-on-tones, a small light floral print, a contrasting lime tone-on-tone fabric, a small border stripe that is used in an inner border and for the binding, and a large main print for the outer border and in some of the blocks. If you choose not to use a border stripe then pick a coordinating medium print.

PLEASE READ ALL DIRECTIONS BEFORE PIECING

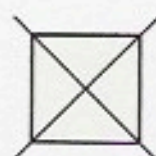
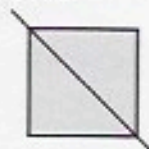
PIECING TIPS:

- * All seams are sewn with $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance. It is important to establish a consistent seam allowance. Try doing a test block first with some other fabric.
- * WOF refers to "Width of Fabric".
- * Press in the direction of the arrows.
- * Use a "measure as you go" system. Measure each section pieced and make corrections before going to next section.
- ** For squares that need a diagonal line down the back center, you can either draw it or press a crease with a hot iron.
- * There are a variety of ways to make Flying Geese units, Half-square triangle units, and Quarter-square triangle units. Make sure after the unit is completed you trim it to the size indicated.

GENERAL PIECING INSTRUCTIONS

HALF-SQUARE TRIANGLES (HST)

A square, cut once diagonally into two triangles.

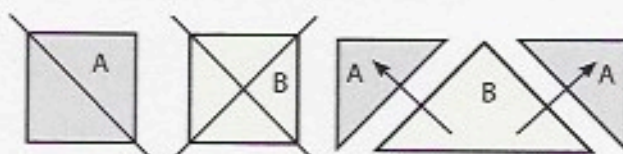


QUARTER-SQUARE TRIANGLES (QST)

A square cut twice diagonally into four triangles.

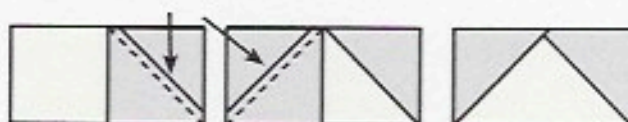
FLYING GEESE (FG) Option 1

Is created with two half-square triangles (A) and one quarter-square triangle (B).



FLYING GEESE (FG) Option 2

Is created with one rectangle and two squares. Draw diagonal lines on the backs of the squares (or press square in half diagonally). Sew on the line one side at a time and trim seam to $\frac{1}{4}$ ".



DIAMOND IN A SQUARE

Is created with a square and four HSTs (A).
